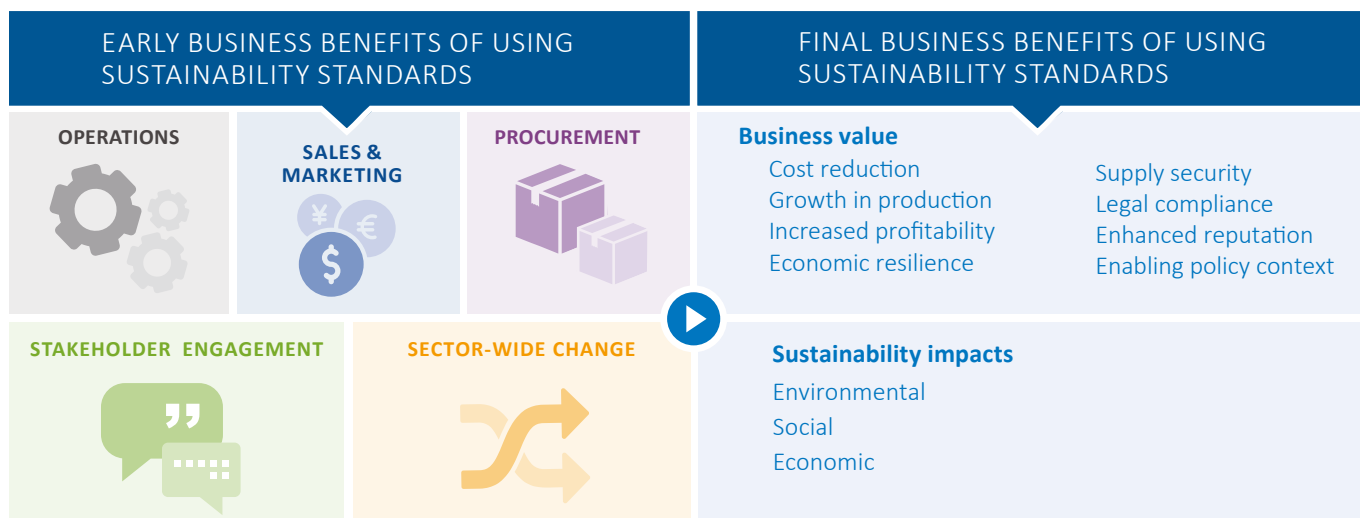


Businesses experience range of benefits from adopting sustainability standards

% refers to proportion of studies reporting a benefit



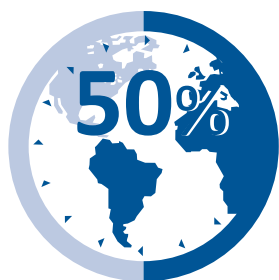

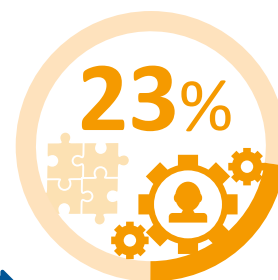
